Jane Miller, PhD



Dr. Miller received her PhD in Chemistry at Tulane University, where between 1950-1952 she worked as an Instructor. In 1953 she was hired as a Research Associate at Washington University Medical School. In 1965 she joined the Chemistry Department at the University of Missouri-St. Louis as an Instructor and was subsequently promoted to Associate Professor, and then to Professor. Dr. Miller became Professor Emerita in 1993 when she retired from UM-St. Louis.

At the University of Missouri - St. Louis Dr. Miller was the first female to hold higher education faculty positions (Instructor, Associate Professor). She was also the first female to have a joint position in Science and Education.

Dr. Miller has served actively on professional committees with a particular devotion on improving the condition and the number of women faculty and staff.

In 2013, Dr. Miller received the UMSL Women Trailblazers Award, as recognition of her pioneering accomplishments as a minority faculty.

Joyce Corey, PhD



Dr. Corey received her PhD at the University of Wisconsin -Madison in 1964. In 1965 she was hired as an Assistant Professor in the Chemistry Department at the University of Missouri-St. Louis, and subsequently promoted to Associate Professor, then to Professor. Today she holds the position of Professor Emerita at UM-St. Louis.

Dr. Corey has been actively engaged and devoted not only in teaching but especially in research: she has published more than a hundred journal articles, mentored 12 PhD students, 2 MS students, and more than 50 undergraduate students.

Dr. Corey's remarkable accomplishments in the Scientific Community as a researcher, teacher, and also as a woman, are clearly shown by the numerous awards and recognition she has received, such as: University of Missouri Presidential Award for Research and Creativity (2002); ACS Midwest Award (2000); UMSL Chancellor's Award for Excellence in Research and Creativity (1994); NSF Visiting Professorship for Women (1984); and Amoco Good Teaching Award (1977).
